- Class tests are conducted to evaluate the performance of students.
- Students are motivated for making use of library and internet facilities available
- Teachers are motivated to make use of modern teaching practices like internet and power point presentations etc.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

In this regard Kurukshetra University is the sole authority for implementation of reforms. But faculty members who are the part of academic bodies of the university actively campaign for reforms.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The faculty is encouraged to go for research activities by participating in various national and international level seminars and workshops. The college also organizes seminars and conferences.
